What Is Comprehensive Housing Counseling?

Quite simply, Housing Counseling is working with someone who can help you take a step back and objectively explore aspects of what you are trying to accomplish that you may not have considered fully. Whether you are trying to prepare to buy a home, deciding if you would rather rent or buy, fighting to save your current home, or just exploring ways to restructure your approach to your housing plan, chances are there are aspects of the process that are less familiar to you or that you are too close to.

Housing Counselors are specifically trained to help individuals navigate through a variety of situations and are exposed to the diversity of ways that issues have been resolved. They can generally help you present documentation in the way that best represents your goals and avoids the pitfalls that cause delays. They can help you spot gaps in your budget or explore more complete ways of looking at your unique situation. Chances are, you are not the first to have faced most aspects of what you seek to accomplish.

Who Needs a Counselor?

Almost everyone can use a little guidance. Looking through this brochure and exploring our website can point you towards answers to some of the most common concerns. If you find yourself confused or struggling with pulling together your arguments, or if you just want a second opinion that you've thought through the key elements in your goal planning, give us a call. Income-based Rental Assistance

Since NWRHA was founded over thirty years ago, our most demanded program has been rental assistance—Section 8, public housing, and tax-credit apartments and condos that many simply refer to as “HUD.” Those programs each have dedicated Contract Managers working in Field Offices located in each county.

Our Housing Counselors can work with that staff when needed but will not replace the work done by those offices. The Section 8 Contract Managers have been specifically trained for those programs.

Housing Counseling at NWRHA

For close to twenty years, NWRHA has maintained a specialized counseling staff to assist with the more diverse housing needs of our constituency. Our counselors maintain certifications and specializations designed to meet local needs at any given time.

Prior to the market collapse in 2008, NRHA provided mostly pre-purchase counseling and first-time homeowner certification for those preparing for transition into homeownership.

Since the bursting of the housing “bubble,” demand has been greatest for home retention strategies such as modification, reverse mortgages, and mortgage payment programs.

Today, the housing market is again changing as people reevaluate their needs and goals with a greater eye towards stability and sustainability. NWRHA understands that nothing brings the same sense of peace and fulfillment that is achieved by being comfortable in your own home.
